The Gospel

1. Jesus and his disciples travel toward _____.

And they were on the road, going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was walking ahead of them. And they were amazed, and those who followed were afraid. v. 32a

2. Jesus speaks again about his upcoming _____ and resurrection.

. . . And taking the twelve again, he began to tell them what was to happen to him, saying, 'See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn him to death and deliver him over to the Gentiles. And they will mock him and spit on him, and flog him, and kill him. And after three days he will rise.' vs. 32b-34

The Servant

1. The disciples are still _____ – particularly James and John.

And James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came up to him and said to him, Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask you . . . grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory. vs. 35, 37b

2. The disciples _____ their understanding.

Jesus said to them, 'You don't know what you are asking' . . . and they said to him, 'we are able'. vs. 38a-39a

3. The other ten were very _____ with James and John.

And when the ten heard it, they began to be indignant at James and John. v. 41

4. Jesus would again address the way His kingdom _____.

And Jesus called them to him and said to them, 'You know that those who are considered rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. But it shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant. vs. 42-43

To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. Colossians 1:27

2. A hopeless man heard about _____.

. . . and as he was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a great crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, the son of Timaeus, was sitting by the roadside. And when he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth . . . vs. 46b-47a

3. He cried out to Jesus for _____.

. . . he began to cry out and say, 'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!' v. 47b

4. Jesus _____ His cry.

And Jesus stopped and said 'Call him.' And they called the blind man, saying to him, 'Take heart. Get up; he is calling you.' v. 49

5. Jesus _____ him and gave him hope.

And Jesus said to him, 'Go your way; your faith has made you well.' And immediately he recovered his sight and followed him on the way. v. 52
